Haywood Co, NC was formed in 1808 and included present day counties of Cherokee, Clay, Graham, Jackson, Swain and part of Transylvania. Samz has incorporated names from missing pages in the current microfilm which makes this edition complete.

3. Haywood County, NC Court Records, Vol. I (1809-1815) Volume 1.

Abstracted by Ann Marie Broadbent (2018) The records were abstracted from microfilm of the original records of the Court of Pleas & Quarter Session minutes from the first two books that were recorded. They contain jury lists, road crews, deed registrations, estate filings, etc.

4. **Permanent Roll of Registered Voters of Haywood County, North Carolina 1902** by Charles Biddix (1990)

Prior to 1913, the state of North Carolina did not require the certified registration of births and deaths. This book provides an excellent supplement to the census schedules.

5. **Portrait of a Mountain Community Haywood Co NC.**, by Curtis W. Wood, Jr (2009)

This book was commissioned by the 2006-07 Haywood Co. Board of Commissioners. It was collaboratively produced by many committees assigned by the Historical Society of Haywood Co. It includes lots of pictures, copies of actual documents and extensive endnotes.

6. **Haywood County, NC Court Records Volume II - 1820-1827 Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions Minutes -** Transcribed by Ann Broadbent

This transcription was made from the first of three reels on microfilm of the Haywood County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions. The court records in this volume cover the period from 1820-1827. Records for additional years will be published at a later date. In this transcription, the spelling, capitalization and abbreviations are exactly as written in the minutes. (Curved) brackets were used in the minutes by the Clerk of Court and have been retained in the transcription. The microfilm of these original records is available online at www.familysearch.org, film #008152453. I have included the microfilm image number for each image in addition to the page number, so that researchers can refer to the original image if they wish. I have also added notes throughout to point out duplicate images, missing pages or mis numbering where that occurs. In some places I have added [square] brackets when I inserted a corrected word or phrase. The only change to the punctuation was to add commas in a list of names. A Glossary is included, and words found in the court records that are included, are indicated with an asterisk*. A full name index is included, and all spellings of given and surnames have been indexed.

7. William Sitton's Store Ledger: Haywood County, North Carolina 1829-1844 (2018)

Transcribed by Ann Marie Broadbent. (2018) William Sitton operated a general store in Haywood Co, NC in the 1830s. This is a transcription of the transactions made in the store including the names of the purchasers, the items sold and prices. Contains a glossary of unfamiliar terms and a short biography of William Sitton.

8. WNC Bastardy Bonds Haywood County, NC 1820- 1899. (2020)

Transcribed by Ann Broadbent & OBCG volunteers. This book was produced from original documents filmed at the NC Archives by OBCGS volunteers. It contains varying records for each bastardy case that came before the Justices of the Peace. These include warrants for arrest, examinations, bastardy bonds, depositions, etc. There are also a small number of unrelated court proceedings such as divorce, assault, and apprenticeship that were misfiled and included with these records.
