

## **African American family research sources at the Regional History and Genealogical Library in Asheville, NC**

This finding aide can assist those researching African American family history. The list below was compiled using various search terms in our card catalog. It will grow as we find other books in the library and add purchased or donated books to our collection. These resources go beyond Buncombe Co., NC to include many NC counties and surrounding states.

Some sources that include an enslaved person’s information are not listed such as books with transcribed or abstracted estate/probate records, court records (Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions until 1868), and land/deed records. Use our card catalog on our website to find these materials for your research location.
